HIGHLIGHTS

Newport, RI

View the fabulous millionaire mansions built in Renaissance, Rococo, French and Victorian style atop Newport's cliffs. Its yacht-filled harbor has hosted the America's Cup. Closer to sea level, the city's streets and sandy shores offer a fine array of picturesque locations for taking in the Rhode Island sea breeze.

FUN THINGS TO DO:

- Visit Rose Island Lighthouse Overlooking Narragansett Bay, This restored 1869 lighthouse still serves as a navigation aid for sailors and is operated by vacationers who act as "lighthouse keepers" in exchange for accommodations.
- Marble House, the Vanderbilt family envisioned this home to be the "Temple of the Arts" in America. This opulent stone palace, inspired by the Petit Trianon at Versailles, was commissioned in 1888, and is opened for tours.
- Take a cliff walk stroll along a picturesque mile and a quarter of Newport's famous Cliff Walk, the path between the rocky coastline and the "backyards" of many of Bellevue Avenue's palatial cottages.

Boston, MA

Boston, the capital of Massachusetts, is one of the most historic cities in North America and home to many of the USA's leading universities, including world-renowned Harvard in neighboring Cambridge. The abundance of historical sights, first-class museums and opportunities to take in a cross-section of cultural activities, music, art, theater and more explain why Boston is one of the country's most popular tourist destinations.

FUN THINGS TO DO:

- View the Public Garden, the first botanical gardens in the country, an oasis in the heart of the city, The garden is home to a majestic monument of George Washington and the famous swan boats, which grace the waters of the lagoon.
- Browse Newbury Street, an eclectic collection of 19th-century brownstones, upscale boutiques, sidewalk cafes and trendy galleries line this enchanting street, situated in the historic Back Bay section of the city.
- Follow the Freedom Trail. Begin at Boston Common and follow in the footsteps of our forefathers on this 2.5-mile trail delineated by red bricks, highlighting 16 of Boston's most historical sites from the American Revolution.

Halifax, Nova Scotia

Located on the shores of the world's second-largest natural harbor, the "City of Trees" adds to the pastoral beauty of Canada's maritime region. An extensive network of walking trails extends from the waterfront out to a series of beautiful parks and vibrant gardens, inviting exploration.

FUN THINGS TO DO:

- Explore the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia's extensive collection, with over 2,000 permanent works.
- Take a historical and anecdote-filled tour through the streets of Halifax. Explore the hilltop fortress and the Citadel, and stroll through the beautiful Victorian-style public gardens.
- Relax on a drive through the beautiful Nova Scotian countryside to the moody, weathered village of Peggy's Cove. Walk along the rocks to view the craggy coastline with its bold glacier-formed outcroppings of granite and its impressive lighthouse.

This tour requires average physical activity. You should be in good health, able to climb stairs and walk reasonable distances, possibly over uneven ground and cobblestoned streets.

GENERAL INFORMATION

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

U.S. citizens on homeport cruises (cruises that begin and end at the same U.S. port) are currently able to enter or depart the country with a state issued birth certificate with a raised seal and government-issued photo ID. AAA recommends traveling with an original, signed passport valid for 6 months beyond stay, and with at least one blank vis page for visa stamp(s).

As travel policies are rapidly changing, requirements will be communicated prior to departure. Please see your Travel Advisor for additional information.

INSURANCE

CLOTHING/CLIMATE

Average temperatures in Canada and New England in July range from the high 70s to low 80s. Daytime, casual clothes and comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Evenings, after 6 pm, on board require smart attire or Gala evening attire in most of the bars, restaurants, and entertainment venues. For the two gala evenings onboard the ship "dress to impress", where you are asked to observe an elevated dress code.

BAGGAGE

Two suitcases per person will be allowed by the cruise line. You may also bring a small carry-on bag.
