Sunday, March 15: Depart Central PA

Sitting majestically atop a high outcrop of limestone in Ireland's Golden Vale in Tipperary, the ancient medieval buildings are positioned right in the heart of Ireland. The remarkable site includes a 15th-century Tower house, a high cross, a Gothic cathedral an abbey and Cormac's Chapel, home to the only surviving Romanesque frescoes in Ireland. Thursday, March 19: Midleton Distillery Experience & Blarney Castle

Discover the Midleton Distillery with a "Behind the Scenes Experience", an exclusive journey into one of Ireland's premier whiskey distilleries in County Cork. The tour starts with a warm welcome from expert guides who lead you through historic 19th-century buildings. Witness the whiskey-making process, from grain milling to triple distillation in copper stills, and maturation in oak barrels. Visit the cooperage to see skilled craftsmen handcrafting barrels. Conclude with an exclusive tasting of rare and limited-edition whiskeys, perfect for whiskey enthusiasts seeking an unforgettable exploration of Irish whiskey heritage. Later in the day, visit Blarney Castle, best known as the home of the Blarney Stone. Legend says, if you kiss the stone you'll inherit the gift of the gab! Monday, March 23: Game of Thrones Linen Mills Studio & Black Cab Tours
