ITINERARY

Friday August 21, 2026: Chicago

Transfer from Central PA, to a local airport for a flight to Chicago, Illinois. Upon arrival transfer to your hotel and settle in for the evening as you get ready for your amazing vacation. Hotel: *Hyatt Regency Chicago*

Saturday August 22, 2026: Chicago
