Daily Itinerary

Saturday, October 3, 2026: Depart Central PA to Vancouver, BC

Transfer by motorcoach from Central PA to a local international airport for a flight to Vancouver, British Columbia. Hotel: *Pan Pacific Hotel*

Sunday, October 4, 2026: Vancouver, BC

Enjoy a tour of Vancouver by coach, visiting landmarks, oceanfront views, and architectural wonders, including the Vancouver Lookout where you will be able to enjoy a spectacular view of the city. Hotel: *Pan Pacific Hotel* (Breakfast)

Monday, October 5, 2026: Vancouver, BC - Kamloops, BC

Travel away from the coast, through picturesque farmlands and stunning canyons and deserts, including Hell's Gate, the historic Cisco Crossing, and Kamloops Lake. In the evening, you are free to explore the city at your leisure. Hotel: *To Be Announced* (Breakfast, Lunch)

Tuesday, October 6, 2026: Kamloops, BC - Lake Louise, Alberta

Travel by rail through Craigellachie, Stoney Creek Bridge, and the Spiral Tunnels on your way to the scenic Lake Louise within Banff National Park. Here, you will check in to your accommodations and enjoy the beautiful surroundings as you prepare for the rest of your journey. Hotel: *Fairmont Chateau Lake Louise**** (Breakfast, Lunch)

Wednesday, October 7, 2026: Lake Louise, Alberta

Take a private motorcoach for a full day of sightseeing at the Icefields Parkway, where you will witness Bow Lake, Athabasca Falls, and the Columbia Icefields. Then, take a unique 6-wheeled Ice Explorer across the Athabasca Glacier, and visit the Glacier Skywalk extending over Sunwapta Valley. Hotel: *Fairmont Chateau Lake Louise**** (Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)

Thursday, October 8, 2026: Lake Louise, Alberta - Banff, Alberta

After Breakfast, take a sightseeing tour of the surrounding mountain lakes and waterfalls, including Lake Louise, Emerald Lake, Natural Bridge, and Takakkaw Falls. Then, continue on to your next stop in Banff National Park, where you will experience spectacular views from the comfort of your hotel. Hotel: *Rimrock Resort Hotel*** (Breakfast, Lunch)

Friday, October 9, 2026: Banff, Alberta

Enjoy a free day to explore or relax at your leisure within the spectacular Banff National Park, or simply enjoy the accommodations and activities of your hotel. Hotel: *Rimrock Resort Hotel*** (Breakfast)

Saturday, October 10, 2026: Banff, Alberta - Calgary, Alberta

Take a sightseeing coach to Calgary, with views along the way including Bow Falls, Surprise Corner, and the Hoodoos of Banff National Park. On your way, stop at the Banff Gondola, where you will ascend Sulphur Mountain for a mountaintop view. Hotel: *Fairmont Palliser Hotel* (Breakfast)

Sunday, October 11, 2026: Calgary, Alberta - Central PA

After Breakfast, transfer to the Calgary Airport for your flight and transportation back to Central PA*. (Breakfast)

Tour Activity Level: 3

Moderate: Good mobility is required for this trip. Climbing stairs and standing for 2-3 hours at a time, as well as walking on uneven terrain may be necessary. Portions of the itinerary may include higher altitudes. The itinerary may include longer days up to 12-14 hours in length. This activity level is not recommended for travelers with significant mobility concerns.

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Frequently Asked Questions

What travel documents do I need to bring?

Original, signed passport valid for 6 months beyond stay, and with at least one blank visa page for visa stamp(s) is required for this trip. As travel policies are rapidly changing, final requirements will be communicated prior to departure. Please see your Travel Advisor for additional information.

Canada reserves the right to deny entry to anyone with a felony conviction, including a DUI record. AAA is not responsible if you are denied entry to Canada and no refund will be provided.

Where will my seat be on the plane?

Air Schedule will be shared once available. Group air schedule is in economy class. Seat assignments are controlled by the airline. Specific seat requests cannot be guaranteed. Air upgrades may be available and are by request only and are not guaranteed. Air upgrade requests may not be on the same flight schedule as the rest of the group and must be requested at the time of the initial deposit. Seat assignments cannot be confirmed until the tour operator releases names to the airline(s) 30 days prior to departure. Some flights may contain code share agreements.

Do I need travel insurance?

For your protection, AAA recommends travel insurance. Pre-existing medical conditions may be waived with proper coverage if travel insurance is purchased within 14 days of initial deposit only. Other conditions may apply; ask your travel agent. AAA recommends Allianz.

What will the weather be like?

Temperatures for the Canadian Rockies can vary from as high as 50-60 degrees during the day, to as low as the mid-10s in the evenings. Additionally, wind can be strong at the altitudes you will be visiting. Please pack layered clothing and comfortable shoes that can be worn in a variety of conditions.

How many bags can I bring?

Due to limited space while touring, all passengers are limited to one checked bag no more than 50lbs. You may also bring a small carry-on bag small enough to fit under your seat. Soft sided carry on bags no larger than 17"x14"x4" with a zippered enclosure are recommended. Wheeled carry-on cases that are used as carry-on luggage on airlines are too large and are not suitable as hand-carried luggage. Baggage fees are not included in the price of the trip. Baggage fees and other charges will be directly assessed by the airlines or the airport.
