## **Tuesday, June 22, 2027 - Sydney, Nova Scotia**

The largest urban center on Cape Breton Island and a gateway to the island's rich culture and natural beauty. Located on the scenic shores of the Sydney Harbour, the city blends maritime heritage with modern amenities. It's known for its warm hospitality, Celtic music traditions, and vibrant waterfront.

### **FUN THINGS TO DO:**

- The Big Fiddle- Sydney's most iconic landmark—a giant fiddle on the waterfront symbolizing Cape Breton's musical heritage. Great photo spot and often a hub for local events.
- Sydney Waterfront Boardwalk- A scenic stroll along the harbor with views of cruise ships, local shops, and cafés. Perfect for relaxing and enjoying the maritime atmosphere.
- Cape Breton Centre for Craft & Design- Showcases local artisans' work, including pottery, jewelry, and textiles. Offers workshops and a gallery for authentic Cape Breton crafts.
- Cossit House Museum- One of the oldest houses in Sydney, dating back to 1787.
- St. Patrick's Church Museum- A historic church with exhibits on local history.
- Jost House- A glimpse into colonial life and early settlement.

## **Wednesday, June 23, 2027 - Halifax, Nova Scotia**

Located on the shores of the world's second-largest natural harbor, the "City of Trees" adds to the pastoral beauty of Canada's maritime region. An extensive network of walking trails extends from the waterfront out to a series of beautiful parks and vibrant gardens, inviting exploration.

### **FUN THINGS TO DO:**

- Explore the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia's extensive collection, with over 2,000 permanent works.
- Explore the hilltop fortress and the Citadel, and stroll through the beautiful Victorian-style public gardens.
- Relax on a drive through the beautiful Nova Scotian countryside to the moody, weathered village of Peggy's Cove. Walk along the rocks to view the craggy coastline with its bold glacier-formed outcroppings of granite and its impressive lighthouse. Drive through the softer South Shore area back to Halifax and enjoy another view of the city.

## **Thursday, June 24, 2027 - At Sea**

## **Friday, June 25, 2027 - St. John's, Newfoundland**

The vibrant capital of Newfoundland and Labrador and one of North America's oldest cities, known for its colorful row houses, rugged coastal scenery, and rich maritime heritage. Nestled on the eastern edge of the continent, it offers dramatic ocean views, historic sites, and a lively arts and music scene.

### **FUN THINGS TO DO:**

- Signal Hill National Historic Site- Climb up to Cabot Tower, where Marconi received the first transatlantic wireless signal in 1901. Explore historic military fortifications, hike scenic trails (like North Head Trail), and enjoy panoramic views of St. John's Harbour and the Atlantic Ocean.
- The Rooms- A combined museum, art gallery, and archives, located on historic Fort Townshend grounds. Offers interactive exhibits on Newfoundland & Labrador's culture, history, and stunning harbor views.
- Cape Spear Lighthouse National Historic Site- Visit North America's easternmost point, featuring the original 1836 lighthouse and WWII coastal defense ruins.
- Basilica Cathedral of St. John the Baptist- A stunning Gothic Revival cathedral dating from 1842–1892, set on Military Road, offering impressive architecture and spiritual ambience.

## **Monday, June 28, 2027 - Qaqortoq, Greenland**

The largest town in southern Greenland, serving as the cultural and commercial hub of the Kujalleq municipality. Nestled on a hillside overlooking Julianehåb Bay, it is home to approximately 3,055 people.

### **FUN THINGS TO DO:**

- **Hvalsey Church Ruins**- The best-preserved Norse ruin in Greenland, dating back to the 12th century. Part of the Kujataa UNESCO World Heritage Site, located about 19 km from Qaqortoq.
- **Stone & Man Sculpture Project**-An open-air art gallery featuring dozens of stone carvings by Greenlandic and Nordic artists scattered throughout the town.
- **Church of Our Saviour**- A striking red wooden Lutheran church built in 1832, located near the harbor.
- **Memorial Fountain**- Greenland's oldest fountain, located in the town square, inscribed with residents' names.
- **Unartoq Hot Springs**- Natural geothermal pools on a nearby island, perfect for a relaxing soak with scenic views.
- **Quayside & Colorful Harborfront**- Stroll among brightly painted houses, fishing boats, and local markets for an authentic Greenlandic experience.
- **Hiking & Fjord Tours**- Explore trails around Qaqortoq or take boat trips to nearby fjords for iceberg and wildlife viewing.

## **Tuesday, June 29, 2027 - Prins Christian Sund (Cruising)**

The Sund is a narrow passage (about 100 km long) cutting through southern Greenland. Surrounded by towering mountains, sheer cliffs, and glaciers that descend into the water. Often dotted with floating icebergs and sea ice, creating dramatic Arctic views. Numerous tidewater glaciers spill into the fjord. Icebergs of all shapes and sizes drift along the route—perfect for photography. Tiny settlements like Aappilattoq appear along the way, offering a glimpse of traditional Greenlandic life. Colorful houses stand out against the stark mountain backdrop. Keep an eye out for seals, seabirds, and occasionally whales in the icy waters. Arctic flora clings to rocky slopes in summer. Waterfalls cascade down steep cliffs, adding to the scenery.

## **Wednesday, June 30, 2027 - At Sea**

Relax and enjoy the onboard amenities or take part in various activities of the ship while you sail.

## **Thursday, July 1, 2027 - Isafjordur, Iceland**

The largest town in the Westfjords region of Iceland, nestled on a narrow spit of land surrounded by steep mountains and dramatic fjords. Known for its stunning natural beauty and rich maritime heritage, it serves as a gateway to some of Iceland's most remote and scenic landscapes.

### **FUN THINGS TO DO:**

- **Historic Town Center**- Charming streets lined with colorful 18th- and 19th-century wooden houses. Reflects Ísafjörður's heritage as a major fishing and trading hub.
- **Westfjords Heritage Museum**- Exhibits on Iceland's fishing history, maritime traditions, and local culture. Located in one of the oldest houses in town.

## **Friday, July 2, 2027 - Reykjavik, Iceland**

The world's northernmost capital, is a vibrant city that blends modern Nordic culture with stunning natural surroundings. Located on the southwestern coast of Iceland, it overlooks Faxaflói Bay and is framed by mountains and the Atlantic Ocean. Despite its small size, Reykjavík is the cultural, economic, and political heart of Iceland.

### **FUN THINGS TO DO:**

- Hallgrímskirkja- Iconic modernist church inspired by Iceland’s basalt columns. Offers panoramic views of the city from its tower.
- Harpa Concert Hall Striking glass architecture on the waterfront. Hosts concerts, cultural events, and offers great photo opportunities.
- Sun Voyager Sculpture- A steel artwork symbolizing exploration and adventure. Located along the scenic waterfront promenade.
- National Museum of Iceland- Explore Iceland’s history from Viking settlement to modern times.
- Perlan- A futuristic glass dome with a viewing deck, nature exhibits, and a planetarium.
- Reykjavík Art Museum- Three locations showcasing contemporary Icelandic art.
- Laugavegur Street- Main shopping and dining street with boutiques, cafés, and vibrant street art.
- Old Harbour- Great for whale-watching tours, puffin excursions, and seafood restaurants.

#### **Do I need a passport?**

Yes, an original, signed passport valid for 6 months beyond stay, and with at least one blank visa page for visa stamp(s). At the time of the printing of this brochure all guests are required to obtain an ETIAS (European Travel Information and Authorization System) Travel authorization for travel to Europe's Schengen Zone (not included in the price of the trip).

Average temperatures in Canada in June during the day range from High 60s-70s, with cooler evenings in the 50s. Greenland & Canada during the daytime ranges from Low 40s-60s, with evenings ranging from low 30s-mid 40s. Casual clothes and comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Evenings require smart casual or semiformal attire, with two evening chic nights onboard.
